As I write, a war is raging in Gaza and Palestinians on the West Bank are being harassed, kidnapped, assaulted and worse at an alarming rate. I simply cannot comprehend the dehumanization that has been put upon the beautiful people of my adopted homeland.

Our lives and plans have been interrupted in a most radical way. In the "little town" that many around the world will celebrate this month, the Christians of Bethlehem have canceled Christmas. Christians in the Holy Land will not be putting up holiday decorations or engaging in festive events. Instead, we are calling on Christians around the world to stand in solidarity with the hundreds of thousands killed and displaced in Gaza.

Even though our regularly scheduled activities have been interrupted, we have turned inwards at Seraj and are caring for our communities in the best way we can—through storytelling, yoga, meditation sessions, music and art therapy, and of course access to our beautiful and safe spaces. We hope and pray for an immediate ceasefire and dream of the day when we can celebrate joyfully again.

# **2023 Annual Report**

## Before the War

Until the war began, 2023 was a great year for Seraj:

- In a Zoom call with the board of directors in the U.S., the chair of the board in Palestine
  reported that Seraj had expanded its reach and is now seen as a "flagship operation"
  within Palestine. While travel within Palestine is not easy, Seraj was sending out
  storytellers beyond its libraries and also providing transportation to bring more people to
  their activities.
- The staff has grown to 8, and a 13th library has opened in Al-Jib.
- In Kufor 'Aqab, someone—it isn't clear who—planted roses in the "Ancestors Garden" next to the library and storytelling center.
- A boy from the <u>Qalandia</u> refugee camp won the 2023 Seraj Storytelling Marathon by telling his story to over 300 people who were gathered in a stadium. (The goal of the marathon is to learn a story and perform it for as many people as possible.) Check out <u>this</u> <u>video</u> to share in the excitement.
- In September, Seraj spent its annual budget for new books at the 13th Palestine International Book Fair in Ramallah

• Fida'a Ataya, Kavalya Atma Kaur, and Hanna Salmon represented Seraj at a festival in Philadelphia, where they were invited to lecture on the difference between men's and women's storytelling traditions.

I became involved with the Seraj Libraries team when I went to Palestine to complete my dissertation research on how Palestinian storytellers use music and how storytelling impacts Palestinian communities.

During my time at the Seraj center in Kufor 'Aqab, I played my *oud* and performed alongside Seraj storytellers Fida'a Ataya and Kavalya Atma Kaur at other libraries, festivals, and schools. Beautiful relationships bloomed from these events, as stories—both from personal memories and folkloric repertoires—were told; laughter and tears bubbled; and our bonds to the land, heritage, and community were strengthened. We

experienced joy and practiced *sumoud* (steadfastness) in the face of profound obstacles to daily life in that region.

My thanks to the Friends of Seraj, whose support makes possible the essential art of storytelling in Palestine, and to Fida'a, Kavalia, Laurie, and the women of the Storytelling Academy for supporting my work and teaching me so much during my time in Palestine.
