Greetings from **Laurie Salameh**, Executive Director, Seraj/Palestine

December 2023

Dear Friends,

I sit here at my laptop with a heavy heart. As I write, the war on Gaza is raging. Violence, kidnapping, and fear have drastically increased in the West Bank. Palestinians are attacked in the U.S. for wearing their traditional scarves. It seems there is no safe place to be a Palestinian in this world. Why?

I've lived here nearly two decades and cannot comprehend the dehumanization that has been put upon the people of my adopted homeland, people who yearn to be free of oppression, to live their lives in peace, to send their kids to good schools, to travel freely within their own country and abroad, to marry whom they wish and make a simple and decent life for themselves and their families.

This current war began on October 7 but it followed decades upon decades of oppression and dehumanization. When there is darkness all around, our eyes become adjusted to that and it's difficult for us to see the light.

So I sit here, in the courtyard of Seraj's library and cultural center in the Old City of Birzeit, surrounded by homes that have housed generations upon generations of families, constructed of stone that has existed longer than I can comprehend. For 200 years, before Seraj turned it into a thriving library, this area was called The Courtyard of Darkness, because its shape made it difficult for light to reach inside the houses. But I allow myself to smile now, knowing that seraj means "the light of the lantern" in Arabic. I watch students laugh and study, girls and boys play guitar and sing together, mothers read to their children, and senior citizens gather to tell old stories. The Seraj Library Project shines light in the darkness.

We are all grieving right now. But how can you grieve an open wound? I'm not sure, but I do know that our work is as important now as it has ever been. We have created safe and beautiful spaces and activities for community members to find their voices, to push against despair, to imagine, dream and play. As you read our report from last year, be proud of all we have accomplished together. Know that your support has and continues to bring joy to the most deserving people and communities.



May our people know peace, and if we cannot find the light in the darkness, may we allow ourselves to be that light.

Ramadan Nights Festival



Seraj hosted its 8th annual
Ramadan Nights Festival, bringing
together storytellers, musicians and
artists who visited each of our
libraries and partner communities
to celebrate the holy month of
Ramadan with stories and songs, as
has been tradition in Palestine for
more than a thousand years.

The festival is a chance for families to break the fast together, connect to generations before and to be together without TVs, phones and video games, to laugh, sing and enjoy.





Storytelling Academy + Curriculum

The Seraj Storytelling Academy is a three-year program in which participants attend weekly classes to learn the art of storytelling and how to collect, curate and perform individual and personal stories. They learn how to find and develop their unique voices. Our students are women from different professions and backgrounds, including teachers, a school principal, a local government official, a lawyer, an artist and many others.



Each year the Academy forms a new cohort of women who grow close to and support one another, both professionally and personally. Even more exciting is watching how they discover the strength and power of their own voices.

The foundation of the Academy is a 300-page Storytelling Curriculum on the art of Palestinian storytelling, written and published by Seraj in Arabic. Almost nothing was previously written on this subject. In the near future, Seraj aims to translate the curriculum into English.



International Storytelling Festival

Seraj held the first
International Storytelling
Festival in Palestine, hosted
by the Storytelling Center in
Birzeit. The festival featured
performances from
professional storytellers from
Palestine, Italy, England,
Ghana and the U.S.



Each performance was delivered in both Arabic and English by a Palestinian and an international storyteller. This festival highlights the importance of fairy tales, folk tales, and wonder tales in honor of our ancestors and the oral traditions kept by women around the world for thousands of years.

A Strong Response to a Deep and Continuing Need

Fiscal Year 2023: Strong Support

Regular donations and the October 2022 benefit event generated a record response from 230 individuals and organizations, including 71 first-time donors: \$152,673. Almost all of these contributions go directly to Seraj/Palestine to support libraries and programs. A remarkable \$375,813 was available to Seraj/Palestine in 2023 because spending was low during the pandemic years. Expenditures included the one-time cost of rehabilitating and furnishing the new cultural centers in Kufor Aqab and Birzeit, which totalled \$213,120.


Fiscal Year 2024: Continuing Need

Before the war began, we planned to send \$170,000 to Palestine from July 2023 through June 2024. The cost of boosting Seraj's social media presence in Palestine was paying off. Enthusiastic attendance at the two new cultural centers called for increased hours, staffing, and programming. We had even begun to explore the idea of opening a library in Gaza. As we write, many programs and all development efforts have paused.

But as we learned when the pandemic lifted, your ongoing gifts will enable Seraj to reopen, revitalize, and redouble its commitment. As things unfold, we will continue to meet the pressing needs of families and communities for civic education.
