
Two New Libraries Lead to a Whole New Scene for Seraj

This has been a monumentous few years for Seraj. The pandemic stoped us cold – in terms of programs and activities. But in the pause a number of amazing things happened. RIWAQ, a group of Palestinian architects, restored a set of 150 year old homes in Kufor Aqab (in the seam zone between Jerusalem & Ramallah). They wanted to have a library in their project and offered Seraj two houses. We were delighted to finally have a home for our long anticipated Storytelling Center.

While we were actively working on the Storytelling Center, the Municipality of Birzeit (home of Birzeit University) approached Seraj. Their Old City (also a RIWAQ project) needed Seraj as a part of their revitalization. Would we join them?

It was an offer we could not refuse – and why we have been so busy in these last months! The two projects mean Seraj is now in the national scene and a major cultural player.

A new Library and the Storytelling Center



National Storytelling Center arose from the need in preserving and retelling community stories and folklore. Support sprung up in honor of the memory of our former board chair, Reverend Cotton Fite. This has been a journey of several years, which included rehabilitating the space, designing an inspirational center and creating simple but meaningful and effective programs.

This summer we held our grand opening ceremony. We are located in the historic old village of Kufor Aqab as part of a "cultural hub." Seraj, along with several other cultural and community-focused organizations, are part of a strategy designed by the architectural preservation organization, RIWAQ to bring to life the old buildings and add much-needed safe spaces to community members.



A New Library and Cultural Center

At the request of the Birzeit municipality, we renovated a worn-down 150-year-old courtyard and its six houses. With the cooperation with RIWAQ organization and a great contractor we've rehabilitated these ruins into one of the most beautiful public spaces in Palestine!

The rehabilitation of the space and opening of the center is just the first phase. The next phase, for which we need your support, is to really bring it to life. We want to bring the highest quality books for both the children and adult libraries, to finish the café to really
